

“TREVIGLIO”

ST. ROCCO'S CHURCH

This Church was probably built following the plague which struck Treviglio in 1529. It was originally a small oratory, with a burial ground accessed through a portico supported by stone columns. In 1630 the oratory was enlarged, but the present shape and size result from radical reconstruction work carried out in 1819 and 1820 when the bell-tower was added.

The internal arrangement is of three aisles with two side-chapels at the end of the transept. The one on the right, the Chapel of Pietà contains an interesting group of 17th century sculptures in painted terracotta.
